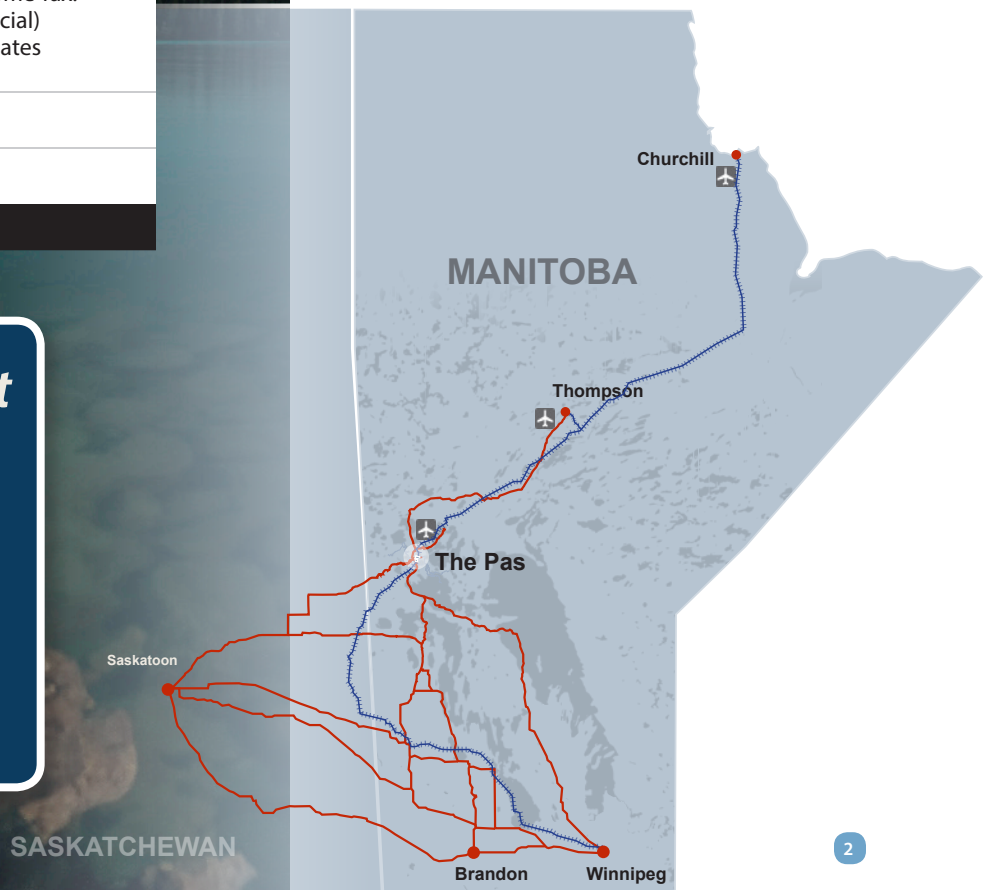

### **Location:**

The Area's major centre, the Town of The Pas, is centrally located in Manitoba and is the largest centre servicing the North. The Town is located at the confluence of the Pasquia River and the Saskatchewan River. It is approximately 520 km northwest of the provincial capital, Winnipeg, and 35 km from the border of Saskatchewan.

### **Accessibility:**

The Area is accessible by its two paved highways, provincial primary highway 10 (the longest highway in Manitoba) and provincial highway 283, which is part of the Northern Woods and Water Route. The Pas has two commercial airports and serves as the rail head for the Arctic Gateway project, that services the North from The Pas to the Port of Churchill seaport in Churchill.

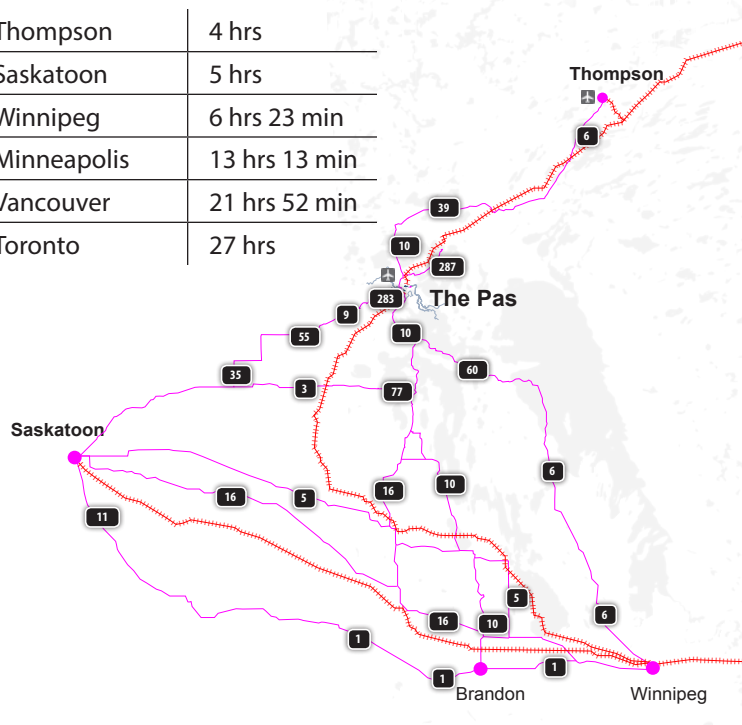
# Transportation

## Overview

The Pas & Area is a transportation hub with its rail head for the entire Arctic Gateway project, major road transportation junction and two commercial airports that service our region. The Arctic Gateway Group owns and operates the Port of Churchill, Canada's only Arctic seaport serviced by rail, on the Hudson Bay Railway, running from The Pas to Churchill, Manitoba.

## Transportation System

### Road system

The Area is accessible by its two paved highways, provincial primary highway 10, (RTAC rated and the longest highway in Manitoba) running North/South and provincial highway 283, running West, which is part of the Northern Woods and Water Route. Currently rated as Class A1, a recently announced \$93M project will soon give highway 283 a RTAC rating.

### Rail system

The Pas serves as the main rail head for the Arctic Gateway project that services the North. The rail line from The Pas to Churchill is forecasted to become busier in the future with the opening of the Port of Churchill. The Hudson Bay railway is 627 miles of trackage, that offers a network that connects with Canadian National in The Pas, running through Manitoba to the Hudson Bay and Port of Churchill.

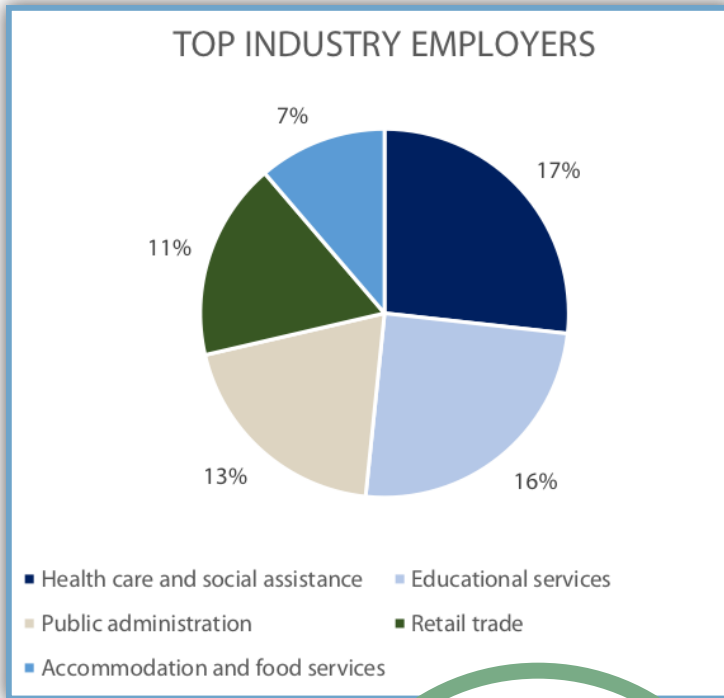

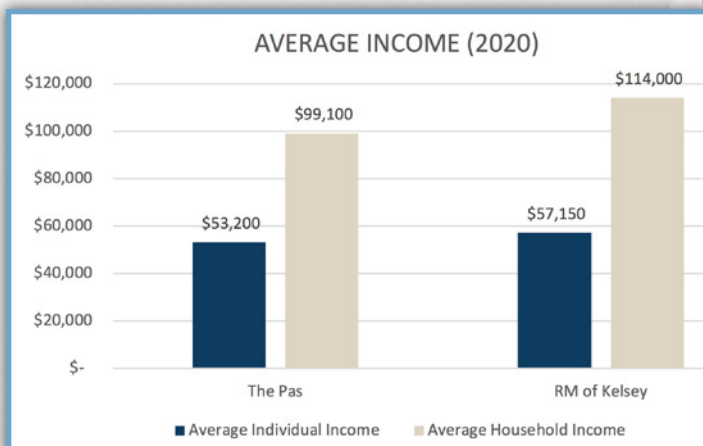

### Industry Supply Chain in The Pas & Area

About 18% (\$93M) of the total purchases from industries located in The Pas were purchased within the region. Significant purchases came from the pulp, paper, and paperboard mills (**\$14.4M**) and motor vehicle parts manufacturing (**\$6.2M**) industries. The majority at 82% (**\$421M**) were purchased outside the area.

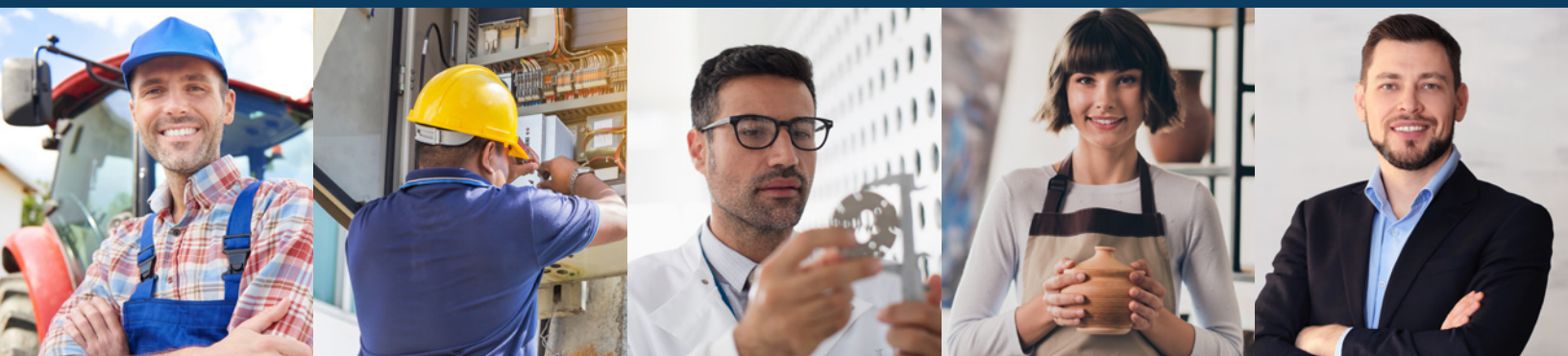

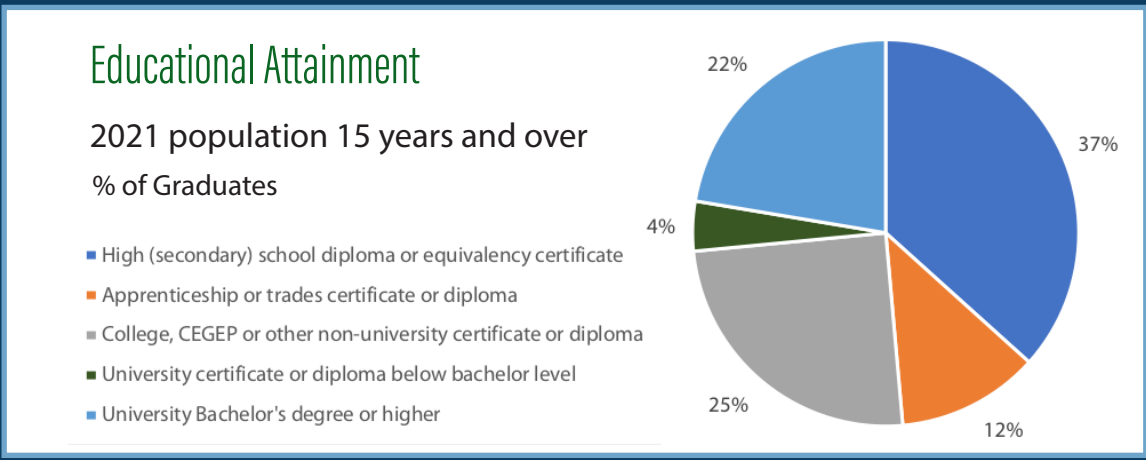

There are four levies against assessable property: Municipal levy (funds municipal services), Local Improvement levy, Kelsey Local tax and Manitoba Education tax (helps fund education).
